BOOK BUDDIES NOW IN EIGHT ALEXANDRIA SCHOOLS

The Alexandria City Public Schools are working hard to strengthen the reading skills of first and second graders. As part of this effort, the ACPS has incorporated the "Book Buddies" plan targeting first graders within eight of our participating schools in Alexandria. If you are matched with a student in the Book Buddy program, written lesson plans for tutoring sessions are tailored to meet each student's current reading level and are supplemented as the child's reading progress improves. Book Buddies training will be held in the school in which you tutor. The program, based on the Book Buddy program designed at the University of Virginia Curry School of Education, will help you make the most of your time spent tutoring your student. The traditional ATC tutoring program continues at Lyles Crouch and Charles Barrett.
